Terms of Reference (TOR) for Outsourcing of Biomedical Waste

Management Service in Orissa

- 1. All the workers engaged by the outsourcing agent shall have uniform.
- 2. All staff of the organization shall bear photo identity card during the period of work, which shall be duly signed by the superintendent of the concerned hospital and representative of the organization.
- 3. All the personnel to be engaged by the organization should be covered under the statutory government regulations framed from time to time.
- 4. The concerned authority of the hospital may request the contractor to withdraw any of his workers from the hospital without assigning any reasons, with 24 hours prior intimation.
- 5. The contractor will abide by all the rules and regulations relating to labour laws, accident, workmen compensation act, workmen insurance, ESI,PF, etc.. This will be the sole responsibility of the contractor. The hospital authority will not be a party at any stage to any kind of dispute relating to the above. In case of any liability arises due to non performance by the contractor, under no circumstances, the hospital authority shall be liable for the same.
- 6. Any damage/ pilferage to the hospital property due to mishandling, carelessness of the contractor or his workmen will be recoverable from the contractor's bill and all materials issued to the contractor shall be his sole responsibility during the period of the contractor.
- 7. The contractor should depute a qualified and dedicated technical staff to manage the waste management activity in the hospital and will coordinate in executing the same with the waste management committee of the hospital and be responsible for supervision of the work.
- 8. All the employees will have to be covered under insurance against any personal accidents and the hospital authority will not be liable for payment of any compensation on that account.
- 9. During execution of work, the contractor should follow all standard norms of safety measures / precautions to avoid accidents/ damages to men, machines and buildings, etc. On non performance to this clause suitable fines as decided by the hospital authority will be imposed.
- 10. The firm must have valid authorization by Odisha State Pollution Control Board for collection, transpiration, treatment and disposal of biomedical waste. (During the contract period).
- 11. The quoting agency must have the last two year of experience of operating incinerator, microwave, shedder and Effluent Treatment plant in any biomedical waste treatment and disposal plant.

- 12. Generator of the bio-medical waste is responsible for providing segregated waste to the container. The wastes shall be segregated as per the provisions of the BMW (H&M) Rules 1998. The contractor shall not accept the non segregated waste and such incident shall be reported to the prescribe authority. Temporary storage at health care unit shall be designated colored containers with cover. Each bag shall be labeled as per schedule III & IV of the BMW (H&M) Rules 1998. The colored containers shall be strong enough to withstand any possible damage that may occur during loading, transportation or unloading of such containers. These containers shall also be labeled as per the schedule III of the rules. Sharp shall be collected in PPC. The person responsible for collection of biomedical waste shall also carry a register with him to maintain the records such as name of the generation point, type and quality of waste received, signature of the authorized person, day and time of collection, etc.
- 13. It is the responsibility of quoting agency to place poly bags in all the bins immediately after collection of the waste is over.
- 14. The collection and transportation of biomedical waste shall be carried out in a manner so as to avoid any possible hazard to human health and environment. The timing of collection of the waste can be fixed after discussing with the waste management committee of the concerned hospital.
- 15. The bio-medical waste collected in colored containers shall be transported to the CBWTF in a fully covered vehicle. Such vehicle shall be dedicated for transportation of biomedical waste only. Depending upon the volume of the wastes to be transported, the vehicle may be a three-wheeler, LMV or heavy duty vehicle. In either case, the vehicle must possess the following:
 - Separate cabins shall be provided for driver/ staff and the biomedical waste containers.
 - The base of the waste cabin shall be leak proff to avoid pilferage of liquid during transportation.
 - The waste cabin may be designed for storing waste containers in tiers.
 - The inner surface of the waste cabin shall be made of smooth surface to minimize water retention.
 - The waste cabin shall have provisions for sufficient openings in the rear end/ or sides so that waste containers can be easily loaded or unloaded.
 - The vehicle shall be labeled with the bio-medical waste symbol (as per the schedule III of rules) and should display the name, address and telephone number of the CBWTF.
 - Depending upon the area to be covered under the CBWTF, the route of transportation shall be worked out. The transportation routes of the vehicle shall be designed for optimum travel distance and to cover maximum number of health care units. As far as possible, the transportation shall be carried out during non peak traffic hours. It shall be ensured that the total time taken from generation of bio-medical waste to its treatment, which also includes collection and transportation time, shall not exceed 48 hours.

- 16. As per the provisions of Biomedical waste (Management and handling) Rules 2016, waste falling in most of the categories can be treated in systems based on non-burn technologies. Such waste account for about 90% of the total waste streams in a health care unit. It is mandatory to impart incineration /deep buriel (depending upon the population of town) to anatomical and other types of waste falling under categories 1 and 2. Therefore an incinerator of adequate capacity to cater only categories 1 and 2 waste shall be installed (if secured landfill is not available, category 5 may also be incinerated). The waste falling under category 5 i.e. discarded medicines, cytotoxic drugs and category 10 i.e. chemical wastes (solid) can be disposed in a secured landfill.
- 17. The contractor/ outsourcing agent shall maintain all the record related to Bio-medical waste management of all the units covering. Daily record shall be maintained for the waste accepted and treated waste removed the site. This record shall include the following minimum details.
 - Waste accepted: waste collection date, name of health care unit, waste category as per the rules, quantity of the waste, vehicle number and receiving date (at site).
 - Treated waste removed: date, treated waste type, quantity, vehicle number and location of disposal.
 - Log book: a log book shall be maintained for each treatment equipment installed at the site and shall include the following:
 - The weight of each batch.
 - The categories of waste as per the rules.
 - The time, date and duration of each treatment cycle and total hours of operation.
 - The complete details of all operational parameters during each cycle.
 - Site records: site records shall include the following:
 - Details of construction or engineering works.
 - Maintenance schedule, breakdowns/ trouble shooting and remedial actions.
 - o Emergencies
 - Incidents of unacceptable waste received and the action taken.
 - Details of site inspections by the officials of the regulatory agency and necessary action on the observations.
 - Daily, monthly and annual summery records of all the above shall be maintained and made available at the site for inspection. Whenever required by an authorized officer of regulatory agency.
- 18. After the allotment of the work, the said contractors shall have to sign an MOU with the concerned hospitals regarding the detail scope of services to be executed.
- 19. The contractors/outsourcing agents shall have to submit performance report (Bi-monthly) to the hospital as well as to the Director of Medical Education and Training, Orissa and joint Director Public Health.
- 20. The agency should collect biomedical waste twice a day once in the morning and in afternoon as per requirement of the department.

- 21. The said contractor will be a period for maximum 2 (Two) years. During this period if at any stage of time, the hospital authority finds non compliance of the assigned work, the said contractor will be served with a notice period of one month and if still non compliance is there, they said contract will be forfeited and new party will be assigned with project.
- 22. The quoting agency will be responsible for any repair/ replacement of the incinerator, microwave, shredder installed in the biomedical waste treatment plant of the hospital arising due to the plant operation during the period of contract. This hospital will not make any additional payment towards repair/ replacement of the equipments installed during the period of the contract.
- 23. The quoting agency will supply sufficient quantity of poly bags (waste collection polythene bags) to the various points of waste generation within the hospital.
- 24. The agency will conduct sensitization programs for hospital staffs (Doctors, staff Nurse, Pharmacist, lab. Techno. And class-iv) with coordination with biomedical waste management Nodal Officer and Hospital Manager.
- 25. The Hospital administration has the right to add in addition to the above terms and conditions as may be considered proper at the time of execution of agreement.
